Recommendations

- There should be cooperation between municipalities and police with respect to giving legal status to the street vendors.
- Vendors need to be protected by government, NGO's, labour union by any labour laws.
- Banks or other financial institutions should provide loans to the street vendors.
- Harassment from local authorities or from policemen during vending should be stopped.
- Municipalities should update national policies for the management of vendors which will be helpful to tackle the social and economic problems associated with vendors.
- Health promotion campaigns must be arranged among street vendors; to raise awareness of work -related issues.
- Adequate facilities should be provided to the women street vendors.
- Education and training programmes for vendors need to be given so as to help them improve their condition.
